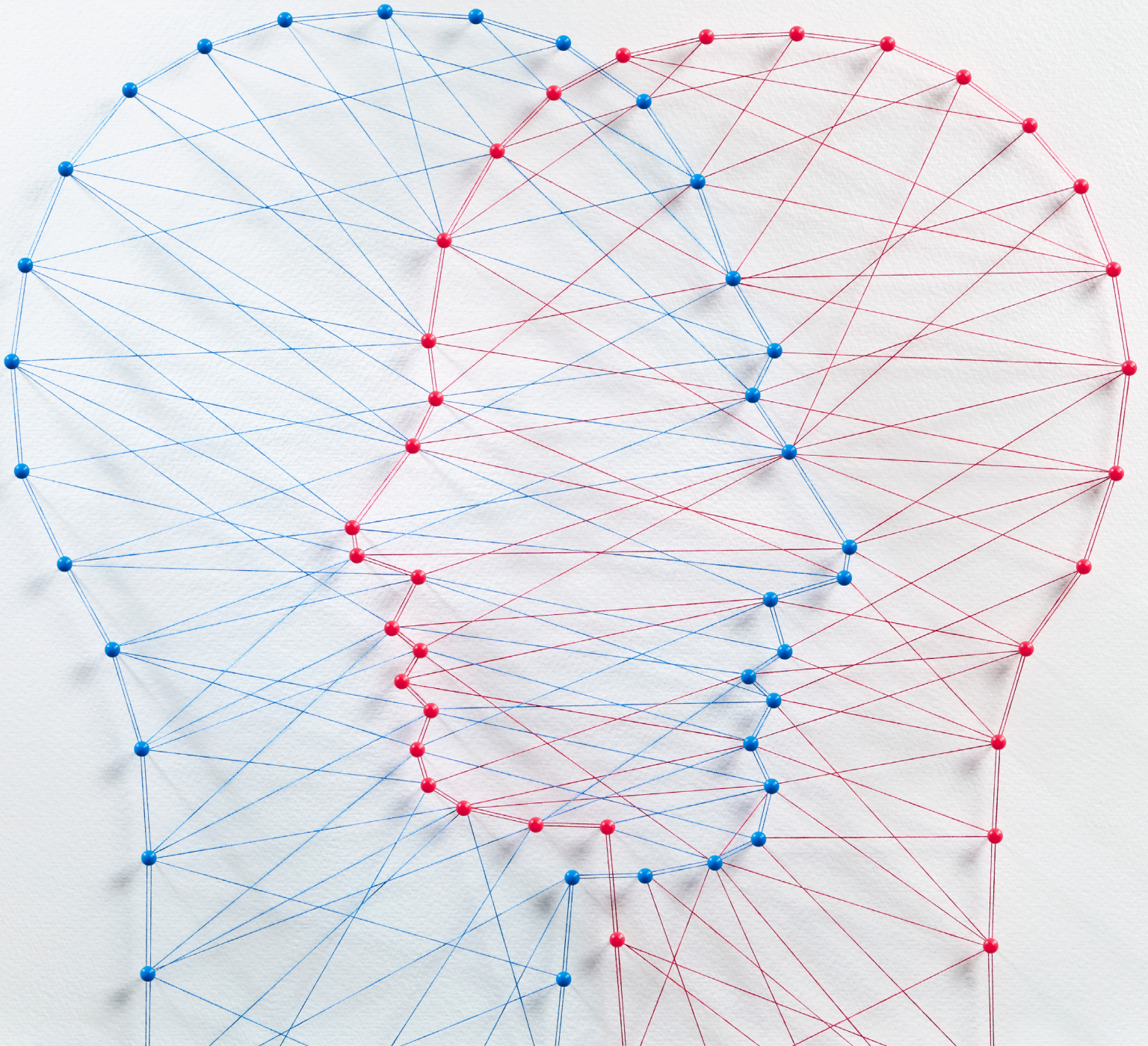

We unify and connect the Jewish community through effective fundraising and philanthropic resources, planning, collaborating with organizations, providing essential services and activities, and developing leaders for our future.

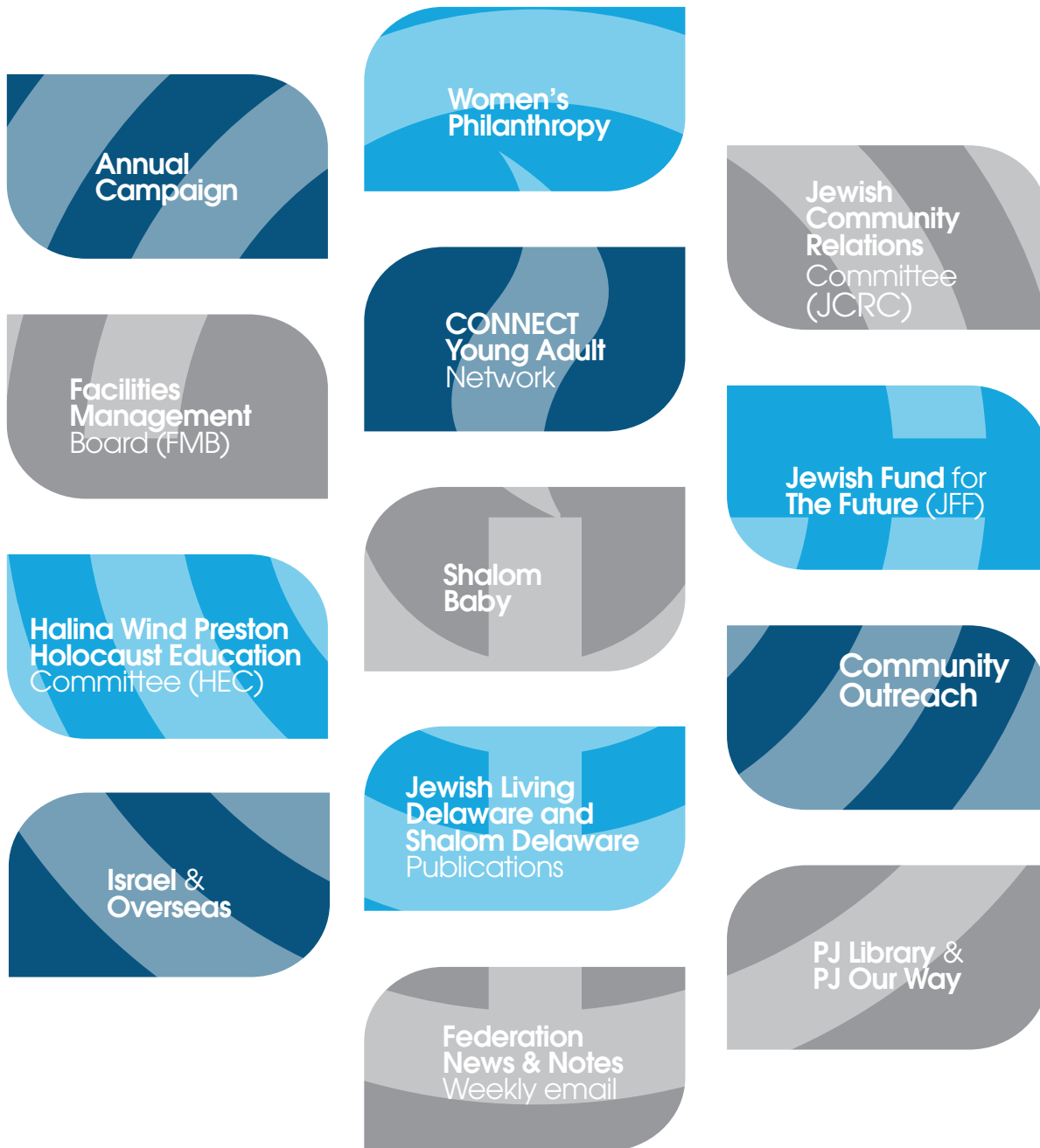

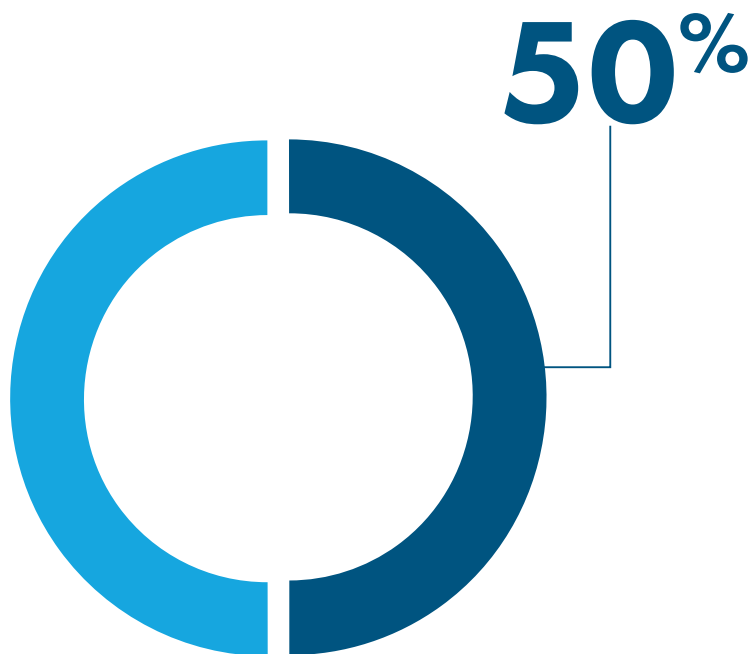




Women's Philanthropy

PJ Library & Shalom Baby

PJ Library

PJ Library is an international award-winning Jewish family engagement program designed to strengthen the identities of Jewish families and their relationship to Jewish community. PJ Library offers free, high-quality Jewish books and music each month to children between the ages of six months through eight years of age. We also now have a PJ Our Way program for children ages 9 through 12. The name "PJ" stands for "pajamas" and invokes that time at the end of the day when parents and children strengthen their bond through love and learning by cuddling up with a book.

Shalom Baby

Shalom Baby is an exciting program designed to welcome parents and their newborns and newly adopted children in Delaware and the Brandywine Valley to our Jewish community. Shalom Baby is also a wonderful way to help new parents find support and build a social connection during this special time in their life. A Shalom Baby Gift Bag, full of fun and helpful gifts, is hand-delivered by a wonderful Shalom Baby Ambassador.

Israel and Overseas

Jewish Federation of Delaware is part of the global Jewish partnership with Israel at its heart. Our relationship with Israel is not strictly one of donor to recipient but one of people to people.

Community Shlichah

A shlichah is an emissary, sent to Delaware through a partnership with the Jewish Agency for Israel that strengthens our community's connection to Israel and the Israeli people. The shlichah provides educational programming for the entire Jewish community and serves as an advocate for Israel within both the Jewish and broader community.

Due to the pandemic, we postponed bringing a shlichah to Delaware but introduced a virtual shlichah, Tal Greenberg, who brought several programs to keep the community. We've hired a new shlichah, Irit Gavse, who will be arriving in August.

Partnership2Gether (P2G)

P2G has become the paradigm for successfully partnering global Jewish communities directly with Israeli communities— the Delaware/Arad partnership connects us communally, organizationally, and personally. The

primary goal of P2G is to develop programs that will build bridges around education, tourism, economic development, and volunteerism.

Ethiopian National Project (ENP)

The Ethiopian National Project (ENP) impacts the lives of countless Ethiopian-Israelis, helping them make the transition to Israeli life and society. ENP provides social and educational opportunities from birth to bagrut (matriculation).

Israel Action Network (IAN) Initiative to specifically address the urgency of responding to a growing assault by governments and NGOs on Israel's legitimacy.

Birthright Israel – Taglit-Birthright Israel provides a gift of first time, peer group, educational trips to Israel for Jewish young adults ages 18 to 32.

JCRC Jewish Community Relations Committee

The JCRC serves as the public affairs arm of the Jewish Federation of Delaware and works with government leaders and the media as an advocate for Israel and brings speakers on Israel and issues of importance to the Jewish community. It also participates in programs and coalitions to enhance good relations among different religious and cultural groups.

The JCRC advances the general welfare of the community by;

- Promoting positive relations and interactions with other cultural, religious, and ethnic groups
- Participating in community coalitions
- Monitoring and responding to activities of extremists and hate groups
- Advocating civil rights for all members of Fighting all forms of prejudice and discrimination
- Creating educational programs on domestic issues such as human rights and constitutional protection

Holocaust Education Committee

The mission of the Halina Wind Preston Holocaust Education Committee is to educate the community on the causes and events of the Holocaust so that its lessons may prevent such a tragedy from happening again.

In May 1978, Halina Wind Preston and Dorothy Finger organized the Holocaust Education Committee. Both Polish Jews who had survived the Nazi Holocaust, they met in Wilmington, where they raised families in freedom. Upon Preston's death, the Holocaust Education Committee was named in her memory.

The Halina Wind Preston Holocaust Education Committee is an interfaith volunteer group comprised of Holocaust survivors and their families, Holocaust scholars, teachers, clergy, and community advocates. Committee members are responsible for the development and implementation of programs. HWPEC is a component of the Jewish Community Relations Committee of Jewish Federation of Delaware.

The Power and Added-Value of Federation

Community Convener

Federation's Vision is to bring Jewish people together into a community coalition, grounded in Jewish teaching and heritage, to strengthen the State of Israel, the Global Jewish Family and Local Organizations to further the survival of the Jewish people.

As the Community Convener, Federation provides complimentary space to our local agencies and synagogues in our weekly email, as well as in our relaunched monthly magazine, *Jewish Living Delaware*, and annually in our *Shalom Delaware* Guide to Jewish Life. We also position our website, ShalomDelaware.org, as the community portal to Jewish Delaware, promoting and providing links to our agencies, synagogues, and partners. This collaborative approach expands the reach of our communications in a more holistic strategy.

Federation will continue to pursue opportunities to progress the coordination and implementation of the **2022 Delaware Jewish Community Study**, our first comprehensive research effort since the 1995 Demographic Study, to better understand the evolving dynamics comprising our geographic footprint and service area. Having

updated data and community insight will assist our agencies, synagogues, and organizations with their strategic planning efforts in building a vibrant and engaged community. We expect the completion of the study in August 2022.

Facilities Management Board (FMB)

As the landlord of our 32-acre Weinberg Jewish Community Campus, Federation established the Facilities Management Board (FMB) which provides oversight to the campus daily operations, property management and capital maintenance policies. The FMB consists of representatives from Federation, agencies on campus, and at-large members.

Through sound fiscal and operational management, on-campus agencies receive a significant rent reduction that is approximately 50% less than current commercial rates and is inclusive of all utilities.

Delaware Rabbis & Cantors (DERECH)

Federation's JCRC Director participates in monthly meetings. Federation has provided technology assistance and support for several community-wide programs the past year.

Federation Shabbat remains an important community-wide collaboration with our synagogues and one of the many unique attributes of "The Delaware Way".

Secure Community Network (SCN)

The Secure Community Network (SCN) is the official homeland security and safety initiative of the organized Jewish community in North America. SCN serves

as the central organization dedicated exclusively to the safety and security of the American Jewish community, working across 146 federations, 50 partner organizations, over 300 independent communities as well as with other partners in the public, private, non-profit, and academic sectors.

Through its operations center and Duty Desk, SCN provides timely, credible threat and incident information to both law enforcement and community partners, serves as the community's formal liaison with federal law enforcement and coordinates closely with state and local law enforcement partners.

SCN works with communities and partners across North America to develop and implement strategic frameworks that enhance safety and security of the Jewish people, developing best practice policies and procedures, undertaking threat and vulnerability assessments, coordinating training and education, offering consultation on safety and security matters, and providing crisis management support during critical incidents.

Ukraine in Crisis – Our Collective

Response The war in Ukraine will create one of the most significant humanitarian crises of this century.

While thousands of Ukrainian Jews have fled the country, most of the 200,000 strong Jewish community is still sheltering within its borders.

Because our partner agencies, the Jewish Agency for Israel, JDC, and World ORT,

have been working steadily in Ukraine for generations – we've been able to be on the ground responding to emergency needs from day one of the conflict.

Our collective system has raised \$60 million to date including our local efforts of \$57,000.

- Distributions of funds are divided into four impact areas:
- Refugee Assistance/Humanitarian Relief and Resettlement
- Aliyah and the Welcoming of Refugees to Israel
- Addressing Needs of Jews in in Other Countries of the Former Soviet Union Affected by the Conflict
- Rebuilding Jewish life in Ukraine

Social Media

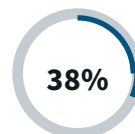

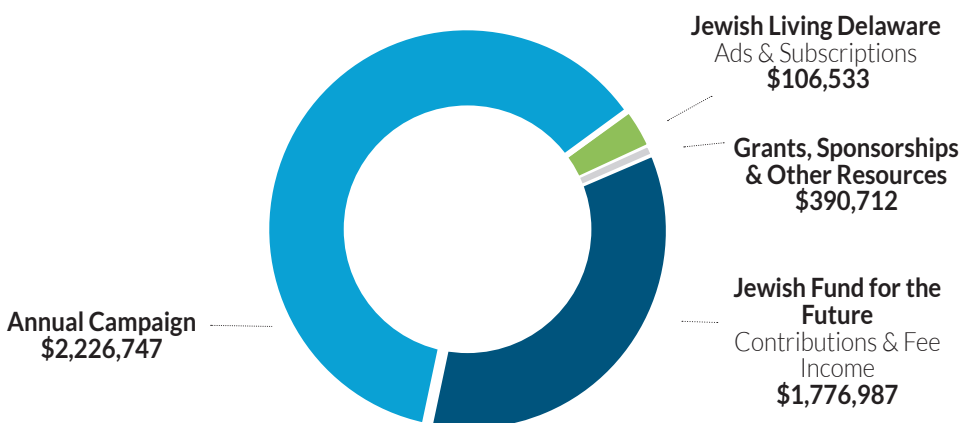

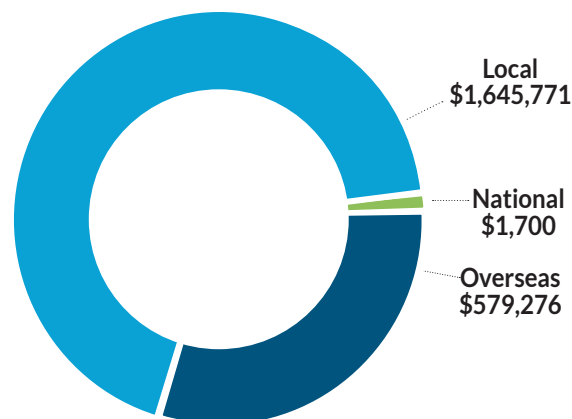

Planned Giving and Endowments

Jewish Fund for the Future

The Jewish Fund for the Future, the planned giving and endowment arm of the Federation, ensures the vitality and future of our Jewish community in Delaware, Israel and throughout the world.

The Jewish Fund for the Future works with individuals and families, financial advisors, along with Federation beneficiary agencies and area synagogues to help donors create Jewish legacies.

As of December 31, 2021, the Fund had \$36 million in Total Fund Assets, the highest in its history. Overseeing 245 community endowment funds, the Jewish Fund for the Future continues to serve as a responsible steward of these legacies by providing support for new programs, stabilizing existing programs and supplementing agency and synagogue needs.

The Jewish Fund for the Future allows donors to meet their personal, family and financial charitable goals. Donors are able to establish their legacy fund today and provide for it in the future using a simple bequest or other source. Endowment legacy funds can be established using cash, securities, real estate or other property, life insurance, IRA or pension plan assets, a charitable trust and private foundation grants.

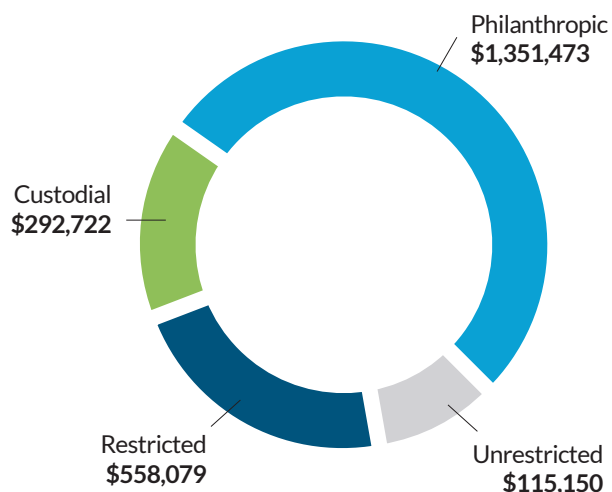

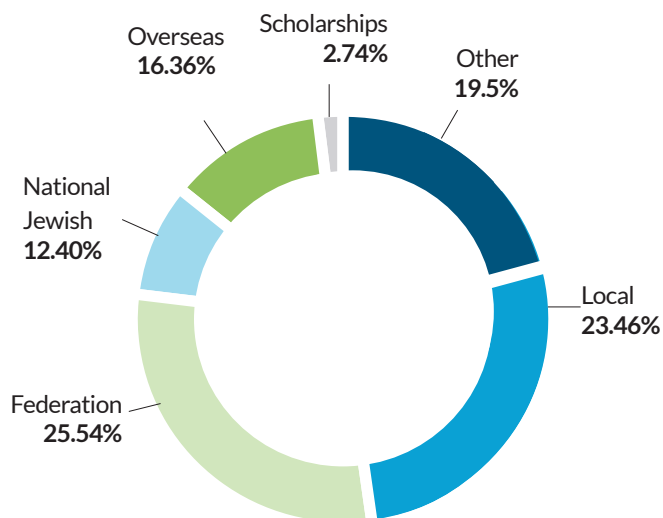
